

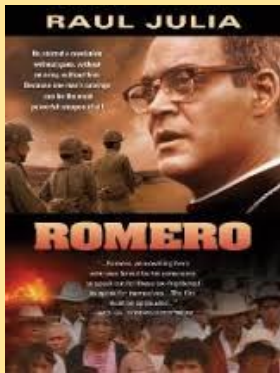


## Merciful Movies – Jubilee Year of Mercy

#### Romero

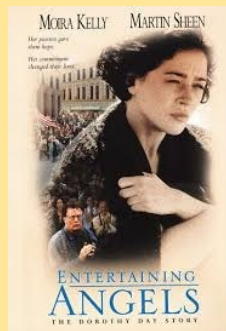


*Romero* is a 1989 movie depicting the life of Archbishop Oscar Romero of El Salvador who organized peaceful protests against a violent military regime and stood with his people in their time of need. His commitment eventually cost him his

life. The film starts *Raul Julia* as *Romero*. This film chronicles the transformation of Romero from an apolitical, complacent priest to a committed leader of the Salvadoran people.

#### Entertaining Angels The Dorothy Day Story

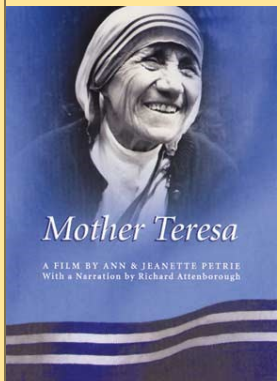


Dorothy Day was no saint but wanted to make a difference. During the Depression she vows to house the homeless, feed the hungry, tend to the sick. Easily said. Not easily done when her total finances amount to 97 cents. Popular stars and important themes combine in this compelling

true story of the “*American Mother Teresa*”. Moira Kelly plays Day, the impassioned journalist who launched the activist newspaper *Catholic Worker* and put the words she wrote into controversial action. Martin Sheen, Melinda Dillon and Brian Keith join Kelly in this moving saga of a faith not just believed, but lived.

#### Mother Teresa

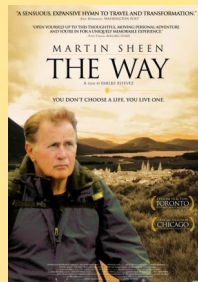


This powerful and inspiring film is considered the definitive portrait of the 1979 Nobel Peace Prize winner, Mother Teresa. Shot on the run over a period of 5 years in 10 countries on 4 continents, this award winning film follows Mother Teresa into the world’s most troubled spots. From the war in Beirut to Guatemala under

siege, from the devastated streets of Calcutta to the ghettos of the South Bronx, this film is an experience of the way Mother Teresa transcends all political, religious and social barriers with her works of love. She dedicated herself totally to God and to a selfless life of service to the poorest of the poor all over the world, regardless of race or creed.

### Part 4 November 18th

#### The Way



Tom is an American doctor who goes to France following the death of his adult son, killed in the Pyrenees during a storm while walking The Camino de Santiago, also known as The Way of St. James. Tom's purpose is initially to retrieve his son's body.

However, in a combination of grief and homage to his son, Tom decides to journey on this path of pilgrims. While walking The Camino, Tom meets others from around the world (three in particular), all broken and looking for greater meaning in their lives.

Along The Way, Tom discovers the meaning of one of the last things his son said (in a flashback) to his father. There is a difference between "the life we live and the life we choose."
