BUILDING PROJECTS

Your great care for your parish has enabled us to stay on top of our significant and expensive physical plant needs. Your generosity is enabling us to steer clear of the financial quicksand of deferred maintenance. We have replaced all our roofs (\$170,000), the church's lights and audio system (\$140,000), and several boilers and AC compressors (\$90,000). With a good deal of outside help, from external donors and government grants, we have installed a new generator (\$40,000) and a security video system (\$35,000). Between June 1, 2016 and June 1, 2023, we spent a total of \$650,000 to keep our house in order.

We are about to spend even more than that in a short time. I want you to understand the projects, their timing, and their funding.

The Pavilion – We are about to build a pavilion to replace the tent that has become a centerpiece of parish life. The project is estimated to cost \$450,000. We now have enough money to complete the project, allowing for 10% overages. It will be funded entirely by restricted gifts. Our operating account will not pay any of these bills. There is a three-month lead on the pavilion itself – which will be built in Lancaster, taken apart, and rebuilt here. The sitework will begin in late summer and we hope to dedicate it in October. The prep work is the hardest part -removing pavement, leveling the ground, bringing in electricity, pouring the footings. The actual assembly of the pavilion will take only four days.

The Church HVAC – Our current equipment is on borrowed time. We are undertaking replacement now, so we do not have to do it on a much more costly emergency basis. The project will cost about \$450,000. I will submit our proposal to the diocesan consultors later this month. Assuming the permissions are granted, we can order the machinery in July. Because there is a sevenmonth wait period for the equipment we need, construction will begin next spring. Each of the three firms that has bid on the project has assured us we will have heat and AC throughout the installation period. Let's hope for no big snafus until then! We currently have \$184,000 in cash earmarked for this project. Given our capital-improvement saving rate of \$8,333/month, we will have an additional \$67,000 when the project begins. That translates into \$251,000 in the bank before we start the project. We are also expecting that a one-time transfer to the parish of \$190,000 will be made before construction begins. Barring unforeseen calamities, all of that money will go to the HVAC. Hence, we will have \$440,000 put aside for the project. This would cause a net reduction of parish savings of \$30,000 - \$50,000. Your generosity enables us to get things done right and on time.

Church Painting – The walls in the Gathering Space, the church hallways, and the Worship Space itself are showing their age. The cracks are easier and easier to

see and the paint does not look spiffy. We are gathering three bids for painting plans from diocesan-approved church-design firms. The first bid came in at \$105,000. I expect the others to be in the same neighborhood. We currently have \$72,000 in restricted gifts earmarked for the painting. If everything goes VERY well, we might be able to paint this summer.

Overall Cash – Again, your generosity makes all the difference. In recent years, we have spent \$650,000 on required work. At the same time, our cash balances have grown from about a half million dollars to their current level of \$1,541, 276. Of that, \$850,000 is neither "restricted" nor "unavailable." This is just about what this fund should be this year My best guess is that the church painting will consume about \$30,000 of the \$850,000. The HVAC will consume another \$75,000, at most. Thus, after completing the next three projects, at a total expense of about \$1,000,000, our unencumbered cash reserves will decline by only \$100,000. This is possible only because your generosity enables us to stash away \$8,000 every month.

I fully realize that we have many slightly optimistic assumptions built into this outlook (i.e., the \$180,000 gets here on time, the costs do not escalate enormously, etc.), but the assumptions reflect our history, a history of great commitment by all parishioners and hard work by the councils and staff to minimize costs and maximize outside help.

There will be much activity in the upcoming months. We will have some minimal disruptions in normal operations and we will experience a slight, and probably temporary, reduction in our cash balances. But all of these projects promise to glorify God and to enrich our lives as priest, prophets, and queens/kings.

It is a great privilege to be your pastor.

I send this with great blessings and enormous thanks – and hope you are able to move into something of a summer mode and all that mode promises.

Jesus was always turning conventional wisdom inside out and upside down—enlightening and enraging people alike. Two thousand years later, we're still trying to figure out how to be happy. If pursuing what the world says "should" make you happy doesn't, take a cue from Jesus and try flipping that faulty logic on its head!

In other words, we need to absorb the full example and teachings of Jesus to live a righteous life. That's a tall order, which is precisely why we need each other for support and guidance. How can you support a fellow disciple today?

On May 25, 1899, Pope Leo XIII promulgated the encyclical *Annum sacrum*, which consecrated the entire world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Leo called this the "great act" of his papacy. In an interview with Catholic News Service, Father Ambrose Dobrozsi of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati says that this solemnity, "shows that humanity still needs and longs for a compassionate and all-powerful God. ... In a society where some live in decadence and prideful luxury while others are destitute, the burning love of Christ's Sacred Heart reminds us that the fires of his mercy are also fires of justice." Consecrate your own heart to the effort to create a more compassionate and just world.
